It could be the last world cup for prominent players like Neymar, Messi, and possibly even Ronaldo, which is indeed sad news for all football fans, as a legendary era is beginning to end. Many football fans expected an Argentina vs Portugal finals as it sure promises a thrilling and nail-biting match when two masters of the game: Messi and Ronaldo go face to face. Unexpectedly Portugal failed to qualify for the semis, which was extremely shocking for Ronaldo's fans, and me being one among them was heartbroken. The 22nd edition of the FIFA World Cup has been full of upsets and astonishments making way for unpredictable yet exciting tournament for all football lovers.

In probably the wildest final in the tournament's 92-year history, Argentina won its third World Cup title by beating France 4-2 in a penalty shootout after a 3-3 draw featuring two goals from the 35-year-old Messi and a hat trick by his heir apparent, France forward Kylian Mbappé.






