So let's create spaces for our children to express themselves freely and attain overall growth. As a school we are committed to provide nourishment and avenues for success as per their aspirations and dreams.



Session on coronavirus – How to protect yourself and others?

- What is Covid -19?
- It's an infectious disease caused by the SARs- CoV Virus. Experts say it originated in bats
- Mode of transmission -People release respiratory fluids during exhalation in the form of droplets carrying virus and transmit virus. Risk of transmission is greater within 3 to 6 feet
- Symptoms -may appear 2 to 14 days after exposure. Common symptoms include fever, cough, tiredness, loss of appetite and smell.
- Coronavirus risk factors People who are older have a higher risk of serious illness from covid -19. Certain medical conditions which increase the risk include High blood pressure, serious heart disease, weakened immune system.

CORONA VIRUS PREVENTION ACTION PLAN: GETTING VACCINATED IS A KEY PART OF PREVENTION

- Hand Wash- Wash your hand often with soap and water or clean them with alcohol-based sanitizer. Demonstration also given about how to do handwash.
- Wearing Mask -Cover your nose and mouth in public. Cloth mask is more advisable since it is reusable whereas surgical mask can be used only for four hours. Keep a 6-feet distance between each other.
- Healthy diet -
- Eat fruits and vegetables rich in Beta carotene
- Intake of Citrus fruits
- Get plenty of sleep
- Eat nuts especially almonds.
- Outbreak Management in school -
- Identify an outbreak-Any student with symptoms need to be to the taken to the health room.
- School physician and/or nurse shall evaluate the student as per the case definition of COVID-19. and the same to be informed to the parents as well.



We were all elated because we gave our audience a clear picture and awareness.



"Parents have to put themselves in the shoes of teens and understand their problem. The teens also understand the hardships parents undergo to educate and provide for their needs and wants. Parents are not perfect and children are also not perfect, so they can hurt each other. Forgiving the hurts and insults caused on either side can help free and frank communication between parents and teens.

Google has been a really useful platform over the years, but sometimes we try to self-diagnose by typing in our symptoms and feelings. How do we confirm that we aren't actually suffering from a disorder and are the websites that test us for disorders accurate?

"Google does not have any intuition, gut feelings about you like a real doctor. When a doctor observes a patient and examines, he is able to arrive at a diagnosis. Typing a list of symptoms brings out the worst conditions in which one or many of those symptoms may be present. But it is not true at all. Google doesn't care about Your health nor does it know about your health. Googling can quickly overwhelm you, causing severe anxiety (Cyberchondria)."

This is so very true since a lot of us have, let's admit it, google-searched for symptoms and panicked about our non-existent 'Health abnormality.' We must

abstain from doing so, and get in touch with a doctor if the symptoms affect our daily routine.


How do we stop ourselves from overthinking?

Overthinking. To magnify the situation larger than an electron microscope ever can. And then panicking about how the situation is not going according to our plan. And then freaking out about the worst and most gruesome outcomes of that situation. Dr Suresh talks about this indirect trigger to anxiety, and how to prevent it from pulling us down.

'To think about something too much or for too long is overthinking. Overthinking can lead to anxiety and anxiety by itself aggravates overthinking. Living in the moment and taking control of your mind can stop negative emotions in their tracks. Fear of losing control over life when life does not progress the way you like are the root causes of overthinking. So, fantasizing and meticulously planning various life events should be avoided, so as to prevent the fear that life wouldn't progress the way you want.

Teenage years can be tough. Teenage years through the pandemic can be strenuous and perplexing in its own way. But we must always learn to look ahead to the light shining at the end of the tunnel. And remember that God is holding our hand while we're walking through the dark valleys.

¹⁄₄ tsp	Vanilla Extract
1 Cup (130g)	Maida/All purpose flour
1/8 tsp	Baking Soda
¼ Cup	Chocolate Spread

Step 1: Into a mixing bowl, add eggs and beat it until it is foamy. Then add milk, sugar, honey and vanilla extract. Beat well until the sugar is dissolved.

Step 2: Now, add Maida and baking soda to it. Mix it well so that no lumps are formed. Batter should be at the right consistency for pouring, not too thick and not too thin. Rest it for 10 minutes.

Step 3: After 10 minutes heat a pan with some oil. Pour a ladle of batter and cover it with a lid. Heat should be on medium -low. Flip it and cook for a couple more seconds.

Step 4: Once the pancakes are

cooled spread a thick layer of chocolate spread and cover it with another pan cake.






